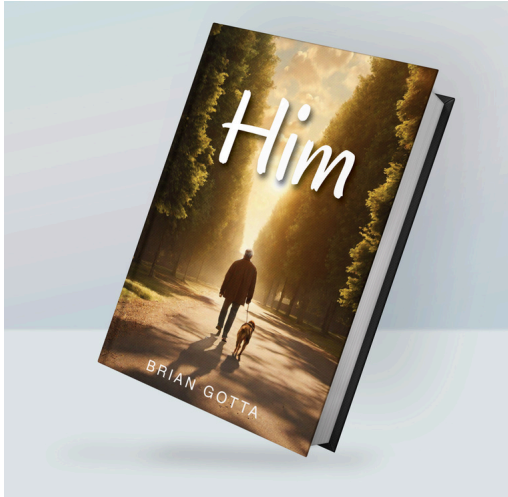


THE SEASON'S NOT OVER

Q & A FOR PRESS

How did you get your start writing books?

During my career as a sales manager, I began to journal the things I was teaching to my salespeople everyday, which resulted in my first book, *Congratulations! You're a Millionaire*.

I have a business associate who is retired and lives alone. One day he emailed me that he was going to miss our call because he was going out to get his new best friend. The poignancy of that struck me and, immediately, I had the idea for the novel.

I am a singer/songwriter and my band, Grand Adventures, just released our first album.
